DIRECTIONS

- 1. Insert the CD into your computer's CD-ROM drive.
- 2. Open the Teacher Materials folder, which includes:
 - ★ Teacher Classroom Presentation Guide
 - ★ Teacher Reference Eye Exam Diagram PDF
 - ★ In-Class Worksheets PDF (includes Coloring Sheets and Eye Exam Diagram)
- 3. Download, print and refer to the Teacher Presentation Guide PDF and Teacher Reference *Eye Exam Diagram* PDF during the lesson.
- 4 Download *In-Class Worksheets* PDF. Copy and distribute to students to complete during lesson.

Finally, download, copy and send home with each student a parent letter and *Safety Eye Check Worksheet*. One activity book (found in your teacher folder) should be given to each student to take home as well. There is a student certificate on the back of the activity book.
